The Arboretum opened its doors to the public on Thursday 17 September 1840.

The park has a beautiful heritage landscape and a superb collection of trees, listed in the tree catalogue

THE HISTORY OF DERBY ARBORETUM

The Arboretum was the first public park in England, opened in 1840 and donated to the people of Derby by the renowned mill owner and philanthropist Joseph Strutt.

Joseph Strutt named this public area 'The Arboretum' although it is now known as Derby Arboretum. The Arboretum was designed by John Cladius Loundon, who created a historic, unique and varied landscape in picturesque style. Loundon created a naturalistic environment which reflects a walk in the countryside with an element of discovery.



An important quality of the Arboretum was its role as a botanical collection within an attractive parkland setting. The recreation ground is an exceptionally early example of playing fields envisaged as part of a public park and is, therefore, also of particular historical interest.

In 2005 a restoration programme of the Arboretum was completed through Heritage Lottery funding. This resulted in the rejuvenation of the historical buildings and landscape and the provision of new facilities, including the Heart of the Park building, a café, changing rooms, a new play area, sports courts and educational facilities in Grove Street Lodge.

NATURE IN DERBY ARBORETUM

The Arboretum is situated within a dense urban area and provides a vital environment for wildlife close to the city centre. Throughout the park the trees and shrubbery offer food, roosting and nesting sites for a wide variety of birds, including Goldfinch and Fieldfare.



Visit the wildlife area, which is a dedicated part of the park with a conservation focus. There is a pond with a wetland soak away and marginal planting. A dipping platform has been installed to support environmental activities, allowing easy access.

The Arboretum has a superb collection of trees, some of which were planted in the 19th century!

One specimen of Caucasian Lime is the tallest tree of its type in Britain. Download a free tree trail leaflet at inderby.org.uk/parks

There are lots of organised activities such as walks, nature trails, and pond dipping in the spring and summer for pre-booked groups.
